It was on October 6, 1935, that Smt Ratan Shastri and Pandit Hiralal Shastri founded Banasthali Vidyapith to fill up the vacuum caused by the sudden death of their highly promising daughter Shantabai. They had high expectations that she would work for women's cause. The spontaneous idea that the vacuum could be filled by educating daughters of their friends and relatives on similar lines resulted in creation of Banasthali Vidyapith. Thus, Banasthali is a spontaneous creation from 'SHUNYA' rather than a planned one as is the case with most of the academic institutions. Here the spirit of Shantabai has been and will continue to remain the guiding and motivating force behind all the thinking and action.

Over the last eight decades Banasthali has developed into a Premier National Institution for Women's education and has achieved the status of institution deemed to be university. Late Smt. Indira Gandhi inaugurated the university on October 31, 1983.

Presently about 14,000 students from all over the country and outside speaking different languages and belonging to different castes, creeds and religions are receiving education at the Vidyapith. It is the only fully residential institution for women education located in rural surroundings providing educational facilities from nursery to Ph.D. level in one campus amidst the ambience of Indian Ethos. Its Five Fold Educational Programme (Panchmukhi Shiksha) comprising of Physical, Practical, Aesthetic, Moral and Intellectual aspects aiming at holistic development of

Indian economy has exhibited a remarkable economic growth during the post-reform period. However, the benefits of reforms have largely bypassed agriculture sector which showed low growth in spite of the fact that agricultural growth was deemed central to the attainment of inclusive growth. Despite trade liberalization, the agricultural sector in India neither experienced any significant growth nor did it derive the expected benefits. As a matter of fact, when compared with the immediate pre-reform period, agricultural growth in India recorded a visible deceleration during the post-reform period. Though the contribution of agriculture to GDP had declined to below 14 per cent it still constitutes an important sector of Indian economy providing employment to around 50 percent of the workforce. It is high time now that we focus on rejuvenation of agriculture and view the sector as a vehicle of growth for the non-farm sector.

We hope to have useful discourse on the issues and challenges concerning Indian Agriculture during post reform period so as to help formulate suitable policies.

How to reach Banasthali

Railway Station: Banasthali-Newai W.R. (Jaipur - Sawaimadhopur line). The distance between Railway station and Banasthali is $9\,\mathrm{kms}$. Institution's mini bus runs in between railway station and Vidyapith campus on nominal fare.

Road link : 72 kms. from Jaipur. 8 kms. Off Jaipur - Kota Road. Several buses of Rajasthan State Road Transport Corporation runs in between Jaipur (Sindhi Camp) and Banasthali Campus.

Persons travelling by bus from Kota will have to disembark at Newai and take connecting bus. The distance between Newai and Banasthali is 11 kms.

Air link:

Sanganer (Jaipur) is the nearest Air-port for Banasthali. It is 60 Km. from Vidyapith Campus.
